### Advice for a job interview

A large proportion of university students work part-time on or off campus. A job interview, as an essential stage of gaining a part-time job, has always been seen as a daunting prospect and never more so than in this day and age, when the marketplace is overflowing with job hunters and consequently competition is really tough. So the question is, whether you can make such a good impression at a job interview that out of the candidates interviewed, you are the one selected.

First and most importantly, do your homework as preparation is 90 percent of the battle. Find out all you can about the organization you will be working for, the job itself, what qualifications and experience are required and how you, specifically you, are able to meet those requirements. Take as much time as you need to work out what questions you are likely to be asked, researching this if necessary, and how you will answer them. Decide also on what questions you should ask, questions that alert the interviewer that you want to assure yourself that the position is right for you.

Having done all the above, getting a friend to play the part of an interviewer, and role-playing the interview is crucial to your success. Your friend should be able to pinpoint the kinds of mistakes that could lose you the job. Ensure that your answers to questions are succinct, and don't talk too softly.


On the day itself, it goes without saying that you should be smartly dressed and arrive 15 minutes beforehand, as being late for a job interview would be fatal. On entering the interview room, scan the room once and make eye contact with the interviewer, offer a firm handshake, and don't sit down until asked. Having done your homework, relax and be yourself, allowing the interviewer to see who you are and relating to them as a person, not a scared interviewee. You're in with a good chance!

### Do you live to work or work to live?

"Do you live to work or work to live?" is a question that most working people get asked at some point in their lives. One's instinct is that most people would place themselves in the second category, feeling that work takes second place after family, friends or interests, and that a job's main purpose is the age-old one of earning the wherewithal to maintain oneself and one's family. Imagine then the surprise caused when a major survey exploring attitudes to work revealed that as many as 65 percent of its respondents gave answers that were categorized as "live to work" compared with only 35 percent being categorized as "work to live."

Of those whose answers fell into the former category, 31 percent said that they got a lot of satisfaction from their job, while a further 21 percent claimed that they loved their job and would not give it up even if they won the lottery. Another surprising statistic was the fact that women claimed to enjoy their work more than men, with as many as 71 percent of women saying that they lived to work compared with 59 percent of men. An interesting gender distinction, one that is perhaps to be expected, given what is known about differences between men and women, was that the main reason cited by women for enjoying their work was the social opportunities that it provided, whereas men were more inclined to say that they took pride in their work and that it gave them a sense of accomplishment. Perhaps the most interesting response of all was how few respondents gave purely economic reasons for working.

When considering the survey's results, it is important to bear in mind that a single survey cannot be given too much weight, and also that it was carried out in a specific country notable for its strong work ethic. It would be fascinating to see what similar surveys carried out in other countries would reveal.

### Volunteering boosts students' prospects

- A) For years, charities across the globe have been encouraging students to join their volunteering programs to help make a difference in the world. Volunteering can be a humbling experience, allowing you to see the world in a different way. Whether you agree to volunteer for a number of consecutive months, a week, or a day, the impact could be life-changing. There's also a strong sense of achievement and pride that comes with generously giving up your time for a worthy cause.

Of course, fundraising is an extremely important part of any charity, particularly those that do not have government funding and rely on donations. Whether it is at home or abroad, the benefits of volunteering are vast for the volunteer not just the community, individual, or organization receiving their assistance. So, let's take a closer look at the ways volunteering experience helps students to boost their prospects.
- D) Volunteering allows students to make a difference. It's an extremely rewarding experience, and students may even find themselves putting their own problems into perspective. This is particularly the case when students decide to go abroad and work for a cause. The process of learning about different cultures and how other people live can be eye-opening. It can be easy to get consumed in your day-to-day life, particularly as a student with pressures of deadlines and studying for exams. Volunteering can be an escape from the daily routine, allowing students to get away from studies for a much-needed break and make a difference.
- E) Volunteering helps develop skills. Where possible, it can be beneficial for students to search for roles in their fields. For example, volunteering can help students to build leadership skills, especially if they're responsible for a group of people. Leadership is a wonderful skill to have, and it's also transferable to many different job roles.
