



Around the World



Break-dancing is a form of street dancing that incorporates body movements, coordination, style and aesthetics. Sounds like a fun game, right? Parkour is not exactly a sport. It was not developed for competition. It is more about learning to control mind and body in difficult situations.





Orienteering is an adventure sport where participants navigate using a map and a compass to find their way between some control points. The control points are marked on a specially drawn map. The skills required for orienteering lie in choosing the best route between control points. The mental challenge as well as the physical activity makes orienteering a popular sport.
