

## Tips to avoid distractions and stay focused on studying

College life can be overwhelming when you're trying to maintain good grades, work a part-time job and balance relationships. Most of us get distracted with push notifications, text messages and phone calls. According to research, the average student is distracted for at least 5 out of every 15 minutes they set aside for study, mostly as a result of texting and social media use.

With so much going on, it can be very difficult to stay focused, but it's not impossible. Here are several tips to help enhance your productivity.

Firstly, make a schedule or to-do list. Juggling multiple projects and deadlines at school can be stressful. When you're working on one assignment, it's easy to forget about another. You can keep track of all your deadlines and manage your time more efficiently by creating a proper schedule. Figure out when you're most productive and set time aside for homework and activities. Keeping a planner or digital calendar will help you keep track of your classes and assignments.

Secondly, turn off alerts. Constant notifications and text messages are every college student's enemy. Put your phone on silent or in "Do Not Disturb" mode, and close unnecessary tabs on your computer. If you need the Internet, keep only one tab open. You can fight against online distractions by blocking or hiding time-wasting websites and apps.

Thirdly, break down your work into smaller tasks. Defeat procrastination (拖延) by breaking a large project into small pieces. It's easier to motivate yourself to do something in smaller tasks rather than diving into a huge project. If you're having a difficult time studying or getting work done, break up your time effectively. Try giving yourself a 10-minute break for every 45-50 minutes of work you do. Studies show that taking breaks can help you retain information and increase productivity.

Lastly, reward yourself. A little motivation can go a long way. Setting up a reward system is a good way to encourage yourself to do something. For example, if you finish an essay without any distractions, reward yourself with something enjoyable, like watching a video or taking a nap.

#### Teaching you time management

#### Helping you assess understanding of concepts taught in class

- Homework is the only opportunity to read new reference materials. Without homework, you depend on your tutor and the proposed reading list. Assignments lead you to the library or the Internet in search of solutions.


